The Getty Campus Heritage Grant will provide funding to develop a holistic preservation master plan, guidelines, and related educational opportunities. The project's goals are to:

- redefine the historic campus and processes;
- initiate learning experiences for students of historic preservation, as well as staff responsible for ongoing campus maintenance;
- bridge the gaps between theory, research, and practice of campus preservation;
- encourage and provide guidance for projects to restore and rehabilitate campus buildings and landscapes;
- develop a master plan and guidelines that are specific to this campus and that also may serve as a model to other entities.
